Background & Key Messages

About Alannah & Madeline Day

Alannah & Madeline Day is **Tuesday 17 September 2024** and is the annual fundraising campaign for the Alannah & Madeline Foundation. All donations made between the hours of 8am – 8pm AEST will be doubled up to \$150,000. This means donations will go twice as far in helping children heal, recover and thrive from trauma and violence.

Every child has the right to feel safe, loved and supported. But too many children face extreme violence instead. Without the right support, their trauma can impact every part of their lives.

Supporting Alannah & Madeline Day will alleviate the immediate need of these children by providing a Buddy Bag to them in a moment of urgent need. It will also provide children with the long-term support they need to heal, recover and thrive, such as one-on one therapy programs.

Right now, 1 in 2 children who need a Buddy Bag are missing out due to a lack of funding. We simply can't meet demand. Your support and commitment can change that.

Key Messages

- Each year 11,000 Australian children are taken into emergency care because they're at serious risk of harm or have no safe place to live¹.

- We know that one in six women and one in 16 men experience violence at the hands of their current or former partner and that more than half said their child saw or heard the violence².
- These experiences can leave children and young people feeling scared and alone, often
 placing them in unfamiliar environments and separated from parents and siblings. We
 know that many arrive with nothing but the clothes they are wearing and with no other
 belongings.
- We provide these children and young people with Buddy Bags. These are brand new backpacks thoughtfully packed by volunteers with items to help meet their immediate material and personal care needs such as toothpaste, PJs, underwear, socks and a soft teddy bear.
- Our Buddy Bags provide these vulnerable children and young people with a sense of security and comfort as the first step on their journey to safety and recovery.

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The Alannah & Madeline Foundation was founded 26 years ago by Walter Mikac AM, and a small group of volunteers in memory of Walter's young daughters Alannah and Madeline Mikac, aged just six and three, who tragically lost their lives along with their mother and 32 others at Port Arthur in Tasmania on 28 April 1996. The Foundation was established with the belief that "all children and young people should be able to live a happy and safe life, free from violence and trauma."
